


Percent distribution of adults by tobacco use, Assam 2016-17



About GATS

The Global Adult Tobacco Survey (GATS) is a global standard for systematically monitoring adult tobacco use (smoking and smokeless) and tracking key tobacco control indicators.

GATS is a household survey of persons 15 years of age and older conducted in all 30 states of India and two Union Territories. The first round of GATS was conducted between June 2009 and January 2010. The second round of GATS was conducted between August 2016 to February 2017 by Tata Institute of Social Sciences (TISS), Mumbai for Ministry of Health & Family Welfare (MoHFW), Government of India. A multi-stage sample design was used for both rounds of GATS. From each of the sampled households, one household member 15 years of age and older was randomly selected for individual interview. In Assam, a total of 1380 males and 1484 females were interviewed during August-September 2016.


GATS 2 Highlights

- 25.3% of men, 0.8% of women and 13.3% of all adults currently smoke tobacco.
- 50.5% of men and 32.5% of women and 41.7% of all adults currently use smokeless tobacco.
- 62.9% among men and 32.9% of women and 48.2% of all adults either smoke tobacco and/ or use smokeless tobacco.
- From GATS 1 to GATS 2, the prevalence of smoking has decreased by 1.1 percentage points, however the decrease is not significant. The prevalence of smokeless tobacco use has increased significantly from GATS 1 to GATS 2 by 9.0 percentage points. The prevalence of any tobacco use has significantly increased from 39.3% in GATS 1 to 48.2% in GATS 2.
- *Khaini* and Betel quid with tobacco are the most commonly used tobacco products. 23.1% of the adults use *khaini* and 19.0% use betel quid with tobacco.
- The prevalence of tobacco use among persons aged 15-17 has decreased from 19.6% in GATS 1 to 9.1% in GATS 2.
- The mean age at initiation of tobacco use has increased from 18.1 years in GATS 1 to 18.5 years in GATS 2.
- 26.1% of smokers were advised by a health care provider to quit smoking and 30.2% of smokeless tobacco users were advised by a health care provider to quit use of smokeless tobacco.
- 30.8% of all adults who worked indoors were exposed to second-hand smoke at their workplace.
- 15.0% of all adults were exposed to second-hand smoke at any public place⁷.
- 68.9% of cigarette smokers and 58.6% of *bidi* smokers thought of quitting smoking because of warning label. 48.1% of smokeless tobacco users thought of quitting smokeless tobacco use because of warning label.






Age at initiation of tobacco use, smoking and smokeless tobacco use, GATS Assam, 2009-10 and 2016-17




Prevalence of smoking and smokeless tobacco use by age group,





Percent distribution of adults by tobacco use status, GATS Assam 2016-17




Prevalence of most commonly used tobacco products among all adults, GATS Assam 2016-17





(Figures in Percentages)




Percent distribution of daily tobacco users by time to first tobacco use of the day, GATS Assam 2016-17
