The National Fact Sheet Global Youth Tobacco Survey found that nearly 1/5 of the students aged 13-15 used some form of a tobacco but the usage declined by 42% during 2009-2019. The use of tobacco among students across the states and union territories ranged from the highest in Arunachal Pradesh and Mizoram (58 pc each) to the lowest in Himachal Pradesh (1.1pc) and Karnataka (1.2 pc).

<u>Itanagar Capital Region</u> (ICR) deputy commissioner Talo Potom on Tuesday took stock of issues being faced by the government schools of the region.

Potom held a meeting with the principals/headmasters of the government at his office in Itanagar.

Various issues like <u>academic</u> progress, infrastructure, basic facilities like availability of drinking water and electricity, land encroachment and boundary issues, etc were discussed in detail.

The principals/headmasters highlighted that most of the school buildings have been constructed in the late 1970s and hence, were in dilapidated condition and needed immediate repair.

They also requested for the strict implementation of the Cigarettes and Other Tobacco Products Act (COTPA), 2003.

They also appealed to the district administration to carry out a drive to check the sale of tobacco products near educational institutions in the state. The COTPA prohibits selling of tobacco products to minors below the age of 18 years, and in places within 100 metre radius of an institution of education.
