

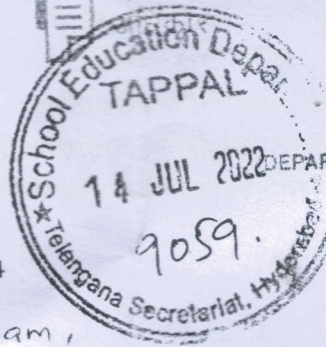

Dear Sir/ Madam,

Tobacco use is the single largest cause of preventable deaths and illness worldwide and kills half of its users prematurely, in their most productive age. The National Factsheet of the Global Youth Tobacco Survey (GYTS-4), 2019 has revealed that 8.5 % of school going children in the age group of 13 to 15 years use tobacco in some form. These findings also indicate that though there is decline in proportion of children that use tobacco, however, tobacco use among girls is on the rise.

2. With the objective of protecting children and young adults against initiation on tobacco use, several provisions have been made in the Cigarettes and Other Tobacco Products Act (COTPA), 2003, such as prohibition of sales of tobacco products within 100 yards of an educational institution, prohibition of sale of tobacco products to or by persons aged less than 18 years and prohibition of any-form of direct or indirect advertisements of tobacco products etc. Recognizing the need for early intervention and for increased awareness about the harms associated with tobacco use, the Ministry of Health and Family Welfare has released the Guidelines for "Tobacco Free Educational Institutions (ToFEI)". The ToFEI Guidelines has already been disseminated to States/UTs through D.O. No. P.16012/16/2017-TC, dated 18th December, 2020. However, the pace of implementation of these Guidelines needs to be accelerated.

3. In this regard, it is requested from you to kindly take necessary action within your State Education Departments/ Autonomous organization, including for School Education, Higher Education and Technical Education, to undertake periodic special drives for enforcement of the provisions of COTPA, 2003 and for implementation of the Guidelines for ToFEI.

4. The role of the States/UTs is extremely important in creating a healthy and tobacco free environment on Educational institutions, leading to a healthier Nation. It is, therefore earnestly requested from all the states and UTs to put in their best efforts for realizing this goal.

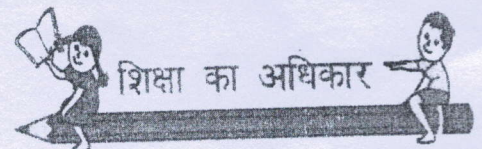


